Previously known as the King's Highway, the Road to Oxford amongst other names. In 1713 Edward Harley, 2nd Earl of Oxford, acquired the land to the north, heading toward Marylebone Road. Edward Harley was married to Lady Henrietta Cavendish-Holles and their daughter married William Bentinck, Duke of Portland. The families gave their names to many of the surrounding Streets in the area.

In the 18th Century the "Oxford Street" name was established and began to be know it
